△ NOTE: This document applies to the final mixture containing 5% of GOLDEN PUMPKIN & SWEET SPICES fragrance and 95% of non hazardous base. All hazard, composition and concentration data have been recalculated from the supplier's original SDS using the CLP calculation method.

SECTION 2: HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

2.1 Classification of the substance or mixture

Classification according to Regulation (EC) No. 1272/2008 [CLP] — calculated at 5% incorporation (additivity method, CLP Annex I):

2.3 Other hazards

According to Annex XIII of the REACH Regulation, the mixture does not contain PBT or vPvB substances at $\geq 0.1\%$.

The mixture does not contain substances with endocrine-disrupting properties at $\geq 0.1\%$.

SECTION 3: COMPOSITION AND INFORMATION ON INGREDIENTS

3.1 Characterisation of the mixture

Mixture: GOLDEN PUMPKIN & SWEET SPICES fragrance at 5% in inert base (95%). Concentrations refer to the FINAL mixture at 5% (supplier SDS ranges $\times 0.05$).

Note: According to the allergen certificate (extended list), actual contents in the pure fragrance are: OTNE 6.250%, coumarin 2.500%, vanillin 2.502%, cinnamaldehyde 1.855%, benzaldehyde 0.881%, linalool 0.250% (in the 5% mixture: OTNE 0.312%, coumarin 0.125%, cinnamaldehyde 0.093%). These values were used in the calculation.

SECTION 4: FIRST-AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of first aid measures

Eye contact	Rinse immediately with running water for several minutes, keeping eyelids open. If irritation persists, seek medical advice.

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SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Suitable extinguishing media	Water spray, alcohol-resistant foam, dry chemical powder, carbon dioxide (CO ₂).
Unsuitable extinguishing media	High-volume water jet.
Specific hazards	Combustion may release smoke, carbon monoxide (CO) and carbon dioxide (CO ₂).

SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

7.1 Precautions for safe handling

Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Wear protective gloves. Ensure good ventilation. Do not eat, drink or smoke while handling. Wash hands after use.

7.2 Conditions for safe storage

Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated place (10–30 °C), protected from light and from heat and ignition sources. Keep containers closed. Keep out of reach of children.



SECTION 8: EXPOSURE CONTROLS / PERSONAL PROTECTION

8.1 Control parameters

The supplier's SDS lists no occupational exposure limits (OEL) for the fragrance components. DNEL and PNEC not available for the mixture.

8.2 Exposure controls

Engineering controls	Adequate general ventilation; local exhaust recommended for hot or large-scale operations.
Hand protection	Nitrile gloves (EN ISO 374 / EN 16523-1), breakthrough time ≥ 10 min for incidental contact.
Eye protection	Safety glasses with side shields (EN 166).
Respiratory protection	Not required under normal conditions with adequate ventilation.
Thermal hazards	Not applicable, unless the base is heated.

SECTION 10: STABILITY AND REACTIVITY

Chemical stability	Stable under normal conditions of use and storage.
Reactivity	Does not decompose if stored and used as directed.
Conditions to avoid	Excessive heat, open flames and ignition sources; prolonged direct sunlight.
Incompatible materials	Strong oxidising agents.
Hazardous decomposition products	In case of combustion: CO, CO ₂ and smoke.



SECTION 11: TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

This mixture at 5% has not been tested as a whole. The assessment is based on the CLP calculation method, using component data from the supplier's SDS and the allergen certificate — extended list (03/08/2026).

Acute toxicity (oral): calculated ATE mix $\approx$ 182,400 mg/kg — not classified.

Skin sensitisation: Skin Sens. 1 — H317 (cinnamaldehyde at 0.093%).

Eye irritation: not classified.

Germ cell mutagenicity, carcinogenicity, reproductive toxicity, STOT and aspiration hazard: not classified (Repr. 2 components individually < 3%).

SECTION 12: ECOLOGICAL INFORMATION

Aquatic toxicity (at 5%): Aquatic Chronic 3 — H412.

Note: The pure fragrance (100%) classifies Aquatic Chronic 2, H411, mainly due to OTNE (Aquatic Chronic 1, M-factor = 1).

Persistence, degradability and bioaccumulation: not available for the mixture.

PBT/vPvB assessment: the mixture does not contain PBT or vPvB substances at $\geq 0.1\%$ (REACH Annex XIII).

SECTION 13: DISPOSAL CONSIDERATIONS

Product waste: hazardous property HP14 (ecotoxic — OTNE H410 $\times 100 \geq 25\%$). Dispose of through a licensed operator according to local/national regulations. Do not discharge to sewers.

Contaminated packaging: empty completely; do not reuse; dispose of through an authorised waste operator.



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SECTION 14: TRANSPORT INFORMATION

Transport classification (at 5%):

- Proper shipping name: not regulated

- Environmental hazard / marine pollutant: no

Note: Not classified as dangerous goods (ADR/RID/IMDG/IATA) — Aquatic Chronic 3 is not regulated for transport. The pure fragrance (GOLDEN PUMPKIN & SWEET SPICES 100%) is UN 3082, class 9.

PCN notification (CLP Annex VIII): REQUIRED — the mixture is classified for a human health hazard (H317). A UFI specific to this mixture is needed before placing on the market; the UFI of the pure fragrance can be declared as a component (MIM).

REACH Annex XVII: pure fragrance subject to entries 3 and 75 (tattoo inks — not relevant). No SVHC or Annex XIV substances.

IFRA (51st Amendment): at 5% it complies with Categories 4, 7A, 7B, 9, 10A, 10B and 12. It does not comply with Categories 1, 2, 3, 5A–5D, 8, 11A and 11B. See IFRA certificate.

SECTION 16: OTHER INFORMATION

Date of preparation: September 2026 — 5% preparation based on the GOLDEN PUMPKIN & SWEET SPICES SDS, the allergen certificate — extended list (03/08/2026) and the IFRA 51 certificate (03/08/2026).

ANNEX — CALCULATION RECORD (5% non-hazardous base)

Method: upper limit of each range in the supplier's SDS $\times$ 0.05; for OTNE, coumarin, vanillin, cinnamaldehyde, benzaldehyde and linalool the actual contents from the allergen certificate (extended list, 03/08/2026) were used. Inert base = 0% contribution.
